

HOW IT WORKS

Get started by downloading the DogSpot app (available in the App Store and in Google Play). The app features an interactive map of DogSpot locations as they pop up, and other cool features like advance reservations, real-time temperature gauges, and a live-stream Puppy Cam of your dog during their session.

DogSpots were designed with the dog's experience in mind and are intended for short trips. DogSpot sessions cost 30¢ per minute, although due to the generous sponsorship of certain location partners and brands, some houses are available for free. The session max is 90 minutes, but our average session is 15-30 minutes.






NEXT TIME, BRING YOUR DOG.

DogSpots are an innovative pet amenity, a first-ofits-kind technology solving a problem that affects cities, business owners, dog owners, and dogs alike. DogSpots are high-tech dog houses placed outside of locations that don't allow dogs inside. Each DogSpot offers the convenience of a leash hook without danger or discomfort, the containment of a car without health risks, and the freedom to bring dogs along despite health code regulations, and the peace of mind of leaving dogs home without neglecting a dog's global needs.

We work closely with businesses and cities that understand the value of dog-friendliness for the economy and for community. As of January 2019, DogSpot is operating 60 houses in 26 cities across the U.S. By the end of 2019, we will have launched an additional 300 new locations in many more walkable cities. We're committed to making the world a better place to have a dog and be a dog.

ABOUT THE FOUNDERS



CHELSEA BROWNRIDGE is DogSpot's Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board.

Born and raised in Charlotte, NC, Chelsea attended UNC at Chapel Hill, where she earned a BA in Economics and co-founded the Carolina Microfinance Initiative. In 2011, she relocated to New York City where she earned her Masters of Public Administration from NYU. Prior to founding DogSpot, she worked in operations and project management at Ashoka and SYPartners, whose missions orient around social impact, innovation and entrepreneurship. Then, in partnership with The Huffington Post, Chelsea co-founded Ignite Good, a nonprofit focused on grassroots movement-building.

While attending graduate school and working at Ignite Good, Chelsea rescued her terrier-mix Winston. With Winston as their inspiration, Chelsea and her partner Todd Schechter dreamed up DogSpot together in 2015. They won financial support from several pitch competitions, including the Brooklyn Public Library PowerUp! Business Plan Competition, the Frontier Tech Startup Showdown, and the National Hardware Cup. They also received support from the NYCEDC Futureworks program and the Urban Tech Hub program at New Lab.

Chelsea currently lives in Brooklyn, NY with her partner, Todd, and her muse, Winston. She is an advocate for rescuing dogs, a secret fan of country music, and a frequent visitor to Prospect Park with her family.

TODD SCHECHTER is DogSpot's Chief Operating Officer and a member of the Board.

A born-and-bred New Yorker, Todd grew up on the Upper East Side and attended Horace Mann through high school. He has two BS degrees from the University of Wisconsin - one in Communication Arts with a focus on Radio, TV & Film and the other in Theater & Drama.

Returning to NYC in 2003, Todd worked as a television documentary producer on independent projects exploring diversity, reconciliation, and global issues. His interest in culture and social change led him to NYU Wagner earning a Masters in Public Administration. Todd's career ventured more and more into the nonprofit world, leading to projects with Criterion Ventures, New American Tavern, PurposeFuel, including when his path crossed with Chelsea Brownridge at Ignite Good...

In addition to his work at DogSpot, Todd enjoys spending quality time with friends, taking long walks around the city with his dog Pepita, and hanging with his nephew Max.
